BURGLARS ARE LOOKING FOR EMPTY HOMES

WHEN YOUR PROPERTY IS LEFT EMPTY FOR PERIOD OF TIME:

Put internal lights on a timer. Get a trusted person to empty the letterbox. Turn Radio/TV on to give an impression someone is home.

GATES/WALLS/FENCES

These are access points to the property and need to be secured.

SHEDS/OUTBUILDINGS

Keep locked, as any tools or ladders would provide the burglar with easier access to the property.

WINDOWS

Keep shut and locked.

DOORS

Keep locked and bolted.

ROOF'S

Flat roof's and bungalows are more susceptible to access through the roof, with burglars moving tiles and cutting through the felt.

YOUR POSSESSIONS

Make a database of all the serial numbers of your possessions so they would be easily tracked.

KEYS

Keep out of reach and sight and don't leave in the doors.

OUTDOOR LIGHTING

Will provide the property protection 1) Alerting you of a potential burglar 2) Potentially scaring the burglar off.

BURGLAR ALARMS

Will warn off potential Burglar's, make sure the Bell Box is in sight but out of reach.

CCTV

Will protect property by recording the property and any possessions, such as cars.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Do not let potential burglars know when the house will be empty by advertising holiday or times when no one is home.
